### The RE have had a busy term. They organised 12 boxes to go to the Samaritans Purse Shoe Box Appeal.


They have also helped to organise the light party and they have chosen our schools Christian Values.

A weekly piece of additional homework will be issued and open homework will be termly. Targets will be available in homework books to support parents who wish to provide further acitivities at home. We aim for this range of homework to suit everyone's needs and enable parents to do as little, or as much, as they see appropriate for their child's needs.
